OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board is continuing to work on adopting a Local Law to include part 1203 of article 19 of the NYS Compilation of codes, rules and requirements. (NYCCRR). Town Attorney, Guy Krogh, has drafted a written local law and the Town Board will review and discuss at the year end meeting.

We have heard back from the NYS DOT regarding the petition for a speed limit reduction on Upper Chase Road. They have stated it is not their practice to establish regulatory speed limits on unpaved highways. These highways have low volume traffic and mostly for local residents who are familiar with the road and its condition and should control their operating speeds based on conditions.

Planning Board Chairman, Donald Chutas, has formally presented the Town Board with requested changes to the Land Use law. The Planning Board would like to add a Section 6.7 to clarify dimensional standards in the Seneca lake Protection Area. The Planning Board would also like to modify Section 10.4 Expansion, Alteration, and Restoration of a Non-conforming structure by returning to the original 25% maximum expansion that was unintentionally removed when the Land Use Law of 2018 was rewritten. The Town Board would like to review and discuss at the year end meeting.

We received the new Mortgage Tax Distribution from the County Legislature. The amount for Reading is \$15,516 which is below what we estimated. It is always difficult to predict what the amount will be when preparing the annual budget. More discussion will be held at the year end meeting.

We will have our Year End Meeting on December 28th at 7:00 pm. Clerk Alger will put a notification in the Watkins Glen Review & Express.
