VISITOR'S COMMENTS:

Mark Rondinaro, Schuyler County Legislature, provided YTD. Sales Tax Information. YTD Sales Tax Revenue including the 1st payment of October was \$13,028,407 for an increase of \$1,123,477 or 9.4%. The 1st Payment of October sales were up by \$44,587 or-4.61% increase from 2022.

Planning Board Chairman, D. Chutas, spoke to the Town Board about approval of the Area Variances issued by the Land Use Board of Appeals for Argetsinger Road allowing a home to be built on 1.18 Acres and also allowing for a 2nd Minor Subdivision on County Road 28 within a 12 month period with a stipulation that no further subdivisions can be held for 24 months..

There were discussions regarding Waste Water System requirements, Statement of Compliance, and Special Use Permits for Short Term Rentals located on private roads. The goal is to make it more simplified. The application fee and renewal period were also discussed. D. Chutas will make revisions and discuss with the Planning Board

Building Inspector, D. Tremblay, has placed a do not occupy placard on a homeowner's residence on PreEmption Road. Supervisor, Miller has continued working with Schuyler County Office of the Aging and Adult Protective Services and other community agencies to help remedy this unfortunate situation.

Supervisor Miller discussed possibly increasing the annual dog license fee due to increasing postage costs and a request from the Humane Society of Schuyler County (HSSC) to send them an increased one-time payment in January to help them with their budget vs sending variable monthly payments of dog licensing fees collected. Supervisor Miller has determined that the \$10 spayed and \$20 unspayed fee is pretty uniform throughout the County Townships.
