Mark Rondinaro, Schuyler County Legislature, provided 2024 Sales Tax Information. YTD Sales Tax Revenue was \$12,069,964. This is an increase of \$507,190 or 4.39% compared to 2023. The September sales tax was favorable. September sales tax had an increase of 8.24% compared to 2023.

OLD BUSINESS

We received several Request for Proposals by the noon deadline of October 9th from engineering firms for quotes on completing an engineering study for the newly proposed water district in the Town of Reading. Supervisor Miller would like some volunteers from the Town Board to help with reviewing the qualifications.

The final draft of the Short -Term Rental Law has been distributed to be reviewed and should be able to approve it at the November 13th board meeting.

The conversion to the new emails has been completed. Haefele is forwarding all emails to the townofreadingny.org email addresses and Clerk Alger has set up an auto response notifying senders that the email address has been changed.

No update on the Judicial reviews disputing assessments. We did receive notice from Real Property that we would need to reimburse one applicant for the \$30 small claims fee as their assessment was reduced in small claims court. Clerk Alger has added this to the October 9 abstract.

The 2022 AUD has finally been submitted and accepted by the NYS Comptroller's office. The 2023 AUD should be completed shortly by bookkeeper H. Ribble.
